THIRD LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY
(Fourth Regular Session)

Begun and held in Cotabato City, on Monday, the twenty-fourth day of April two thousand.

[MUSLIM MINDANAO AUTONOMY ACT NO. 110]

“AN ACT AMENDING SECTION ONE AND TWO OF MUSLIM MINDANAO AUTONOMY ACT NUMBER EIGHTY-ONE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”

Be it enacted by the Regional Legislative Assembly in session assembled:

SECTION 1. Section one of Muslim Mindanao Autonomy Act Number Eighty-One is hereby amended, in part, to read as follows:

“Barangay Talibang is hereby created as a separated and distinct barangay out of the existing sitios of Barangay Kagay, Tabak, Tumangtangis and Buansa in the Municipality of Indanan, Province of Sulu. The sitios to composed Barangay Talibang are as follows: Talibang proper, Sitio Nangkah Gadja, Sitio Duhul, Sitio Kan Wadjah, and Sitio Mampallam.”

SECTION 2. Section two thereof is hereby likewise amended, in part, to read as follows:

The territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Talibang is defined by the following description:

“On the north by Barangay Buansa, on the east by Barangay Kagay, and on the south by Barangay Tumangtangis.


The area of Barangay Talibang starts from Mt. Talibang in Mt. Tumangtangis running down the Kan Awal River 3 km. To the north, thence running 2 km. To the west along the Jolo Buansa Road, thence running upstream the Buansa River 3 km, thence running from said river to the east 3 km.”

SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.


